Targets: We do not yet have our targets for September 2016 entry

Offer level: we hope to go with the highest offer this year, as last year (rather than minimum as in previous year), 60+ points (= SQA AAAA, IB 37, A level AAA+).

College Recruitment Committee (CRC): Proposal to increase College SQA minimum requirements: from 2017, for all CSE programmes, to bring closer to typical offer of AAAA, and higher minimum to attract more well qualified applicants:

SQA Higher AABB (by end of S5) AABBB or AAAB (S4-S6) (from ABBB)

CRC: Contextual Admissions Policy (CAP): more offers will now be made at typical rather than minimum offer level. Context PLUS (C+) still offered at minimum: these are students who may be disadvantaged by both neighbourhood characteristics and school performance. *Implications: may need to provide support for those on minimum offer, once they are here.*

CRC: College Offer-Making Strategy:

RUK - aims to reduce insurance and increase firm acceptances; conditional offers AAA/A*AA SEU - early offers for AAAAA and C+; gathered field for others (Feb/Mar); Waitlist for strong candidates with narrow miss; expect AAAA offers where high demand (decide in late Jan)

CRC: Post Offer Visit Days (PAVDs): Student Recruitment and Admissions (SRA) propose coordinated university wide series of events, with centrally organised information about the student experience (e.g. accommodation, finance). (Currently organised at College/School level - smaller numbers, more frequently). Propose Schools provide academic programme, but fixed number of dates available. Also needs extra resource for SRA, co-funded by Colleges. CHSS and Medicine agreed. Discussed - generally not supported by CSE schools.

Recommend: KF and HW to consider advantages/disadvantages for Informatics PAVDs.

2. POSTGRADUATE TAUGHT ENTRY - 2016/17 Intake:

MSc Fee Deposit Proposal: discussed at strategy committee and generally supported. NH and HP revised the proposal: when student firmly accepts unconditional offer, fee would be requested; deadline in late June/early July, when results are known, time with issue of CASs. Failure to pay will result in offer withdrawn. Discussion of lower deposit (£500?). CRC discussion: our decision, but we could not make changes for the current year...
