## School Strategy and Plan 2018-21 – Learning, Teaching and Student Experience

### **Background**

The School is required to annually review and refresh the School Plan for submission to College. The plan identifies the School priorities across its areas of activity, including learning, teaching and student experience, over a three to five year planning horizon.

## Action requested from the committee

## Main subject text

The School is required to submit its revised plan by the end of the calendar year. The plan includes detailed financial projections for the next three years and highlights the priorities and activities to which those financial projections relate. It also takes a longer term view of the operating environment and how that may impact upon the School and its activities.

No major change is anticipated to the current (2017-20) School Plan, however there will be a need to update progress on actions identified in the plan and to address any more recently identified issues. Amongst the latter will be the School's approach to various distance learning initiatives including the University's Distance Learning at Scale proposals.
