HOW DOES IT WORK?

Staff can spend a week teaching or training abroad via the Erasmus+ programme.

The programme is open to all staff currently employed by the University of Edinburgh, whether full-time, part-time, permanent or fixed-term.

It's not only a great way to pick up new ideas and practices from a different education system, you also have the chance to build relationships at another institution.

Applicants need to research and identify their own teaching or training opportunity.

TRAINING ABROAD

The Staff Training programme is open to all academic and professional services staff. You can apply for funding for all kinds of training. Visits normally last one week and could involve:

- Job shadowing or observation
- Attendance at workshops or courses
- Attendance at a European Staff Training Week

TEACHING ABROAD

You can apply for funding to undertake a Staff Teaching visit to any partner institution. Visits normally last one week and a minimum of 8 hours of teaching is required.

WHAT FUNDING IS AVAILABLE?

- Travel allowance between 180 and 1,500 euros
- Subsistence grant between 140 and 180 euros per day

The amount of funding received will depend on the destination and length of visit. Grant rates are determined by the British Council.

Travel grants can be paid in advance of the activity. Subsistence grants are paid at the end of the teaching or training activity.

WHAT ARE THE SELECTION CRITERIA?

Priority will be given to staff applying for Go Abroad funding for the first time.

Where places are limited, applicants may be offered funding for an alternative destination.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

Erasmus+ Staff Mobility is a career development opportunity which offers the chance to:

- Work with colleagues in your field
- Experience different learning practices and teaching methods
- Take part in an exchange of expertise and knowledge
- Develop your intercultural skills
- Build and reinforce relationships between institutions

A teaching or training visit often leads to new opportunities for collaboration in teaching and research.

The knowledge and benefits gained from your experience can also be shared with colleagues and can be key to motivating students to study or work abroad.
