9. Teaching

Teaching allocations

Teaching allocations for the coming academic year have been confirmed as follows (in fitting with model requested by Sharon Goldwater):

AV, Computer Graphics, IVC, IVR, RSS, Natural Computing IAR (dependent on outcome of BW fellowship application outcome/teaching situation), RL, SDP and MLP.

Staff allocated these courses should by now have received a Theon notice.

Duty allocations

Duty allocations have also been confirmed, Theon notices should be expected soon if not already received.

Poor student satisfaction ratings

Several IPAB courses currently have poor student satisfaction ratings (courses flagged up by Sharon being CG, Nat, IVR, RSS, RL).

Possible factors identified:

- Online format creates a barrier
- Students working alone and reluctant to help one another
- Internet connection quality
- Facilities available to staff within the Forum for online delivery is not sufficient (internet connections, broken microphones, no support etc)
- Student access to suitable/up to date computer equipment required (it is often assumed students have access to what they need, when in fact some don't). Grades achieved correspond with what system the student has access to).

Possible solutions

- Improve access to physical DICE machines (certain software can't be installed on remote DICE/non DICE machines)
- Changes to software required/course re-structure, using lighter simulators
- Push for support from School to provide more powerful computers
- Raise with Teaching Committee

<u>Task Force – intern project</u>

It is proposed the institute appoint an intern over the summer months to look at identifying possible modifications, writing up manuals and training material (Vlad used intern for similar project, worked well).

Staff volunteers will also be required to help with this project, so far Steve has volunteered.

Workshop/away day: Institute Research Agenda and Teaching Curriculum Review

An Informatics wide push to teach larger courses and consolidate smaller courses has identified the need to review the current IPAB courses and content.

Action: Ram to organise a half day review workshop to take place spring/summer.

Server Room issues

A working group has been created to look into this issue, headed up by Boris Grot as Director of Computing. Stefano attends as IPAB rep. Feedback from the latest meeting:

- Large scale problem with no quick resolution
- School is limited in physical space, cooling resources and energy usage
- Equipment has been purchased which cannot be used/installed
- Fairness for new staff is a problem
- Consolidating resources has been identified as a possible solution (GPU machines targeted first)
- A lot of questions raised with no answers

If anyone has a machine which is waiting to be installed or they intend purchasing a machine, they should email Stefano the specifics (GPU's ,energy usage etc). New staff who have money available which they would like to use to purchase machines, should also let Stefano know. This will allow Stefano to have a complete picture to best represent the institute and its position.
